How shall the future SPF-management be organized? Who should be integrated?

- ▲ Defined in OP (Activity Feld 2.2)
- ▲ SPF as umbrella-project, following lead partner principle

How should the cooperation with the neighbouring regions be organized

- ▲ Possible implementation structure (Ladich)
- ▲ Common Steering Committee with each region (Vienna-HU, Lower-Austria-HU, Burgenland-HU)
- ▲ Same deadline for calls

Who should be the target group?

▲ Possible umbrella-project-holders:

- ▶ Regional Managements, Euregios - cross sectoral
- ▶ Communities, „Socialpartner“ - sectoral (e.g. chambers of commerce)

▲ Possible SPF-project-holders:

- ▶ Public / semi-public organisations / institutions
- ▶ Private organisations (e.g. associations, NGO´s)
- ▶ No single persons / enterprises

Budget

- ▲ Minimum total project-budget on both sides of the border: EUR 5.000,-
- ▲ Maximum project-budget: EUR 25.000,-
- ▲ Eligible and non eligible costs=Total project costs
